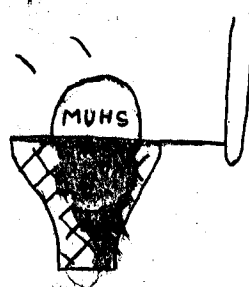

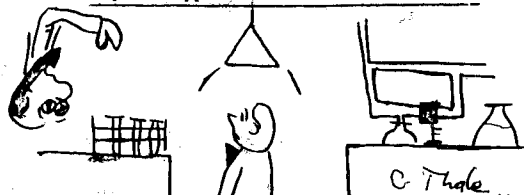


Swift Swimmers Swim Swell

TAKES CHAMPIONSHIP! (SOPHMORES AT LEAST)

After losing their first two games, nobody gave the Sophs a chance to take the crown. Nobody was right. Two weeks ago against Pius they wrapped up the crown.

Marquette started the game with a running attack, but then faked-out Pius when Tom Ryan connected a 52-yard touchdown pass to Jim McCormack who scampered away from the somewhat bewildered Pius defense. After halftime Pius kicked off to Schirf who returned the ball 94 yards for another Topper score. Pius got the ball and scored two quick touchdowns to go ahead 14-13. A determined Marquette came back by driving into Pius territory and topped off the game with a 48 yard touchdown pass to Jim McCormack. This wrapped up the game 18-14.

The plus game ended a season of stout defensive work combined with a good offense. It closed a season of fine playing by Johannes, Rayn, McCormack, Schirf, Schmanski, and, of course, Fred. These are just a few. There were many others.

The sophs won a hard fought championship by winning this game. They celebrated by tossing coach Loeb1 into the showers fully donned. Mr. Ryan, S.J. took refuge in the residence before they got to him.

DONS DOWNED

Terrific is the only word that can be used to describe Marquette's upset victory over Don Bosco. This game was the last of the season, and, true to form, was the best. A quick charging line pushed

the Dons all over the field. The first score, Marquette's, was on a 55 yard pass play from Crossdale to Salchert. Although the Dons came right back and scored the next time they got their hands on the ball, this was the only time they got moving because of an inability to pick up first downs. Marquette moved well on offense all through the game, but three interceptions hurt the Toppers chances for further scoring. It looked as though the game would end in a tie until late in the fourth quarter when Marquette executed a sudden drive capped by a 3 yard run by John Townsend for a touchdown and Binder kicked the extra point. The game was iced when Bosco's Jenders failed to pick up a crucial first down.

Marquette's great defense was led by Bob Teske, Kevin Dunn, Horace Dickey, and Terry Johnson.

We Rastle

After almost two weeks of practice, two tournaments, and three cuts, Marquette's wrestling team has been reduced to just over fifty men. Soon there will be another cut, leaving the squad with 12 varsity and 12 "B" team men (a1 of whom Mr. Ryan terms his "inner core") and about 20 grapplers developing themselves and being used as replacements for injured regulars.

The two tournaments thus far have been on Saturday and Wednesday. Another is expected this Saturday. These wrestle-offs help determine who will wrestle varsity, who will wrestle "B" team, and who will wrestle.

Because of about two hours of sweat nightly, and because of Mr. Ryan's belief that our mat men have the potential for a state championship team, it is not only your duty, but your privilege to attend the first meet of the regular season on December 7.
